San Francisco Federal Credit Union
Teams Up with Habitat for Humanity Greater San Francisco
Revitalize Gilman Playground and Rebuild Housing Structure

SAN FRANCISCO (July 12, 2016) — San Francisco Federal Credit Union announced that it has partnered with Habitat for Humanity Greater San Francisco in an effort to revitalize the Gilman Playground in San Francisco and to assist in a rebuild of an existing building structure within the same vicinity.

“I’m extremely proud of our Credit Union and its employees who participated in the July 9th efforts to clean up and revitalized the Gilman Playground district,” stated President and CEO, Steven Stapp. “One of the hallmarks of the Credit Union is our community involvement by our employees and the giving provided to nonprofit organizations through our Community Share program. Since the Credit Union was founded in 1954, we have recognized the importance of giving back to our local charities, non-profits and our community at large.” Credit Union employees pruned shrubs and trees, removing brush and debris and helping improve and beautify a San Francisco recreational space.

“We’re thankful to partner with community-minded organizations such as, San Francisco Federal Credit Union, in effort to help make our community parks and gardens cleaner, safer and more accessible for everyone,” said Kristine Leja, interim CEO. “Park beautification is part of Habitat Greater San Francisco’s Neighborhood Revitalization program, which aims to extend the work of Habitat into the neighborhoods where we build – renovating community centers, beautifying community parks, gardens and delivering critical home repairs.”

Habitat Greater San Francisco focuses its Neighborhood Revitalization effort on two neighborhoods: San Francisco’s Bayview Hunter’s Point and East Palo Alto in San Mateo County. These neighborhoods were chosen because they have a high volume of long-time homeowners, many who need repairs but may not be able to afford them, and because Habitat Greater San Francisco has a history of building homes in these neighborhoods.
